She enjoyed boat rides and events on the lake, football parties, attending fairs, baking, and cherished moments at the Lunenburg Eagle House and day programs. Wendy is survived by her life partner, Frederick Daley, her daughter, Kasey Newcomb, her mother, Elizabeth Emond, and her brother, Dean Lambert. She was predeceased by her father, Stephen Lambert. Wendy's kind and thoughtful soul will be missed and remembered by the many lives she touched.

Wendy was strong-willed and stubborn, but those traits defined Wendy. They were part of who she was, and her strength undoubtedly helped her deal with life's challenges.
